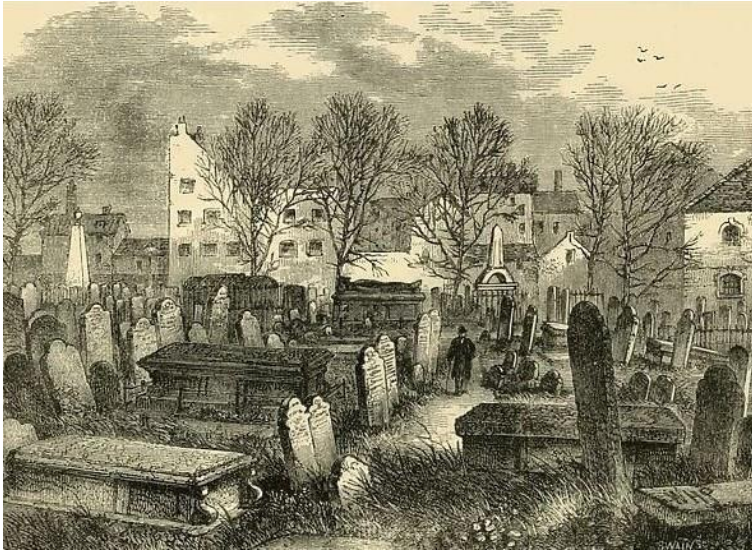

So, what happens when a graveyard gets full? You simply move it - and that's what happened in the 1500s to St Paul's Cathedral. Cartloads of bones were transferred out of the City of London to land in what today we call Bunhill Fields. Over the coming centuries this became the burial place for those not within the Church of England - the Dissenters - and pretty impressive some of them were. Here we find supporters of Parliament, a poet painter, and renowned authors. But the place became famous for more than bones. Living Dissenters still gather here to worship next to their Founder's House and across the way we find the home of the first recorded scorecard for a cricket match. Throw in the Borough Gang and we'll have stories a plenty to while away a pleasant Sunday lunchtime.
